

HOLY MYSTERY OF CHRISTIAN ILLUMINATION: Please contact the pastor in advance to arrange for the required baptismal preparation and formation.







## New Bishop Announced for the

Melkite Eparchy of Newton: Fr. François Beyrouti Bishop Nicholas Samra is happy to announce that His Holiness, Pope Francis, has given his assent to the canonical election of Father François Beyrouti as the 6th Eparchial Bishop of Newton for Melkite Greek Catholics in the United States. Father François, 51, was elected on June 23, 2022, by the Melkite Synod held at the Basilica of Santa Maria in Cosmedin, Rome, Italy. A list of 3 names

was sent to the Dicastery of the Eastern Churches and Pope Francis confirmed the election. The announcement was made on August 20, 2022, by His Beatitude, Patriarch Joseph Absi, Patriarch of Antioch and All the East for Melkite Greek Catholics. Please pray for Bishop Nicholas Samra and his successor Fr. François, that God may preserve them in peace, safety, health, and long life, rightly dispensing the Word of His Truth!

#### A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians

Brethren, you are the seal set upon my apostleship in the Lord. My defense against those who question me is this: Have we not a right to eat and to drink? Have we not a right to take around with us a sister woman, as do the other apostles, and the brethren of the Lord, and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have not the right of exemption from manual labor? What soldier ever serves at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat of its fruit? Who tends the flock and does not drink of the flock's milk? Do I speak these things on human authority? Or does not the Law also say these things? For it is written in the Law of Moses. Thou shalt not muzzle the ox that treads out the grain. (Dt.25:4) Is God concerned about the oxen, or does He say this simply for our sakes? These things were written for us. For he who plows should plow in hope, and he who threshes. in the expectation of partaking of the fruit. If we have sown for you spiritual things, is such an affair if we reap from you material things? If others share in this right over you. why should it not rather go to us? Yet, we have not used this right, but we bear all our expenses. lest we be a hindrance to Christ's Good News.



A WORD FROM THE HOLY FATHERS

**LIVE BY THE GOSPEL**. AUGUSTINE: The Lord directed those who preach the gospel to live by the gospel, that is, to maintain at the expense of the faithful that life for which food and clothing are essential. THE WORK OF MONKS 9.

A SOLDIER AGAINST THE DEMONIC. CHRYSOSTOM: The apostleship was much more dangerous than being a soldier. For their warfare was not just with men but with demons as well. The apostles were both soldiers and husbandmen and shepherds, not of the earth, nor of irrational animals, nor in such wars as are perceived by the senses, but of rational souls and in battle array with the demons. HOMILIES ON THE EPISTLES OF PAUL TO THE CORINTHIANS 21.4.

**GOD'S CARE FOR THE APOSTLES**. ORIGEN: God's care was not only for the oxen but moreso for the apostles, for whose sake he uttered these words. ON FIRST PRINCIPLES 2.4.2.

**AN OX TREADING GRAIN**. CHRYSOSTOM: Why does Paul mention this, when he could have used the example of the priests? The reason is that he wanted to prove his case beyond any shadow of doubt. If God cares about oxen, how much more will he care about the labor of teachers? HOMILIES ON THE EPISTLES OF PAUL TO THE CORINTHIANS 21.5.

**OXEN AND MEN**. FULGENTIUS: These animals accomplish their life and purpose in this world according to the incomprehensible will of the Creator. They render no account of their deeds because they are not rational. "Is God concerned about oxen?" Human beings, however, because they have been made rational, will render an account to God for themselves and for all the things which they have received for use in this present life. TO PETER ON THE FAITH 42.<sup>1</sup>



Eleventh Sunday After Pentecost Parable of the Unforgiving Servant Mt. 18:23-35

The Lord told this parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who desired to settle accounts with his servants. And when he had begun the settlement, one was brought to him who owed him millions. And as he had no means of paying, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all he had, and payment to be made. But the servant fell down and begged him, saying, 'Have patience with me and I will pay you all.' And moved with compassion, the master of that servant released him, and forgave him the debt.

But as that servant went out, he met one of his fellow-servants who owed him a small amount, and he laid hold of him and throttled him, saying, 'Pay what you owe.' His fellowservant therefore fell down and began to entreat him, saying, Have patience with me and I will pay you all.' But he would not; but went away and threw him into prison until he would pay what was due. His fellow-servants therefore, seeing what had happened, were very much saddened, and they went and informed their master of what had taken place. Then his master called him, and said to him, 'Wicked servant, I forgave you all the debt, because you begged me. Should not you also have had pity on your fellow-servant, even as I had pity on you?' And his master, being angry, handed him over to the torturers until he would pay all that was due to him. So also, My heavenly Father will do to you, if you do not each forgive your brothers from your hearts."
